Philippe de Vosjoli has raised caudiciform and pachycaul plants since the 70s when he first saw specimen ant plants (Hydnophytum & Myrmecodia species) at Jerry Horne's nursery in Florida.

In the 80s, while in graduate school, he partnered with Richard Wagner in a part-time business in Massachusetts that specialized in unusual plants, including caudexed succulents they imported from Africa. After moving to California in 1985 to pursue his interest in developing methods for keeping and breeding amphibians and reptiles, he attended several of the Southern California cactus and succulent shows, which reignited his interest in these plants. As an author and publish er of a magazine and over 40 books on

the husbandry and propagation of amphibians and reptiles, he decided to try his hand at writing a plant book on caudiciforms and pachycauls titled Pachyforms, which became a category bestseller. During that time, he also befriended Rudy Lime, a pioneer of SOMA (Succulents as a Medium of Art, a term coined by Rudy) and they worked together to co-author the book Bonsai Succulents. He has just finished a new expanded edition of Pachyforms, which will be available at the meeting.


Pachyforms

An Introduction to some of the most extraordinary plants on planet Earth.

I coined the term 'pachyforms' to describe plants that develop proportionately large and thick bodies, species that include caudiciform (forming caudex-like bodies) and pachycaul (thick trunked/body) succulents. Because many of these plants look otherworldly and like living sculptures, they have become increasingly popular in recent years, often making up a significant portion of cactus and succulent shows and ranking among the best investment plants. In fact, just adding the term caudex in an online plant description will increase the number of views or clicks in social media groups and digital marketplaces (whether the plant develops a caudex or not).

My program will focus on the physical and botanical features of these plants and aspects of their ecologies that are important for their cultivation but not widely known. That knowledge can increase long

term success and produce plants with characters that more closely resemble plants in nature. In addition to plants in cultivation, I plan to show plants in the wild photographed by Rob Skillin, a significant contributor to the expanded edition of Pachyforms.

Insights from the Educational Workshop

TRIMMING with Karen Ostler

This month we held our third workshop of the year. Our very own Karen Ostler showed us how to stage and trim our plants, in preparation for our upcoming shows. Karen's innovative use of chopsticks, to hold up a plant while staging, was invaluable information.

The workshop buzzed with discussions on bonsai techniques, particularly their application in the staging and trimming of cacti and succulents.

Karen recommended techniques through resources like Peter Chan's work, by watching 'Heron's Bonsai' on YouTube. She also emphasized the significance of Navarre (trunk) in trimming and staging practices. She created a Jin (a barestripped part of branch) or Shari on a succulent to accentuate its features.

Karen's demonstration on taming a succulent captured everyone's attention. With deft trimming and hacking, she transformed a mature Bursera into a beautifully composed plant. Her advice on pot sizing—leaving approximately 1" around the plant—and harmonizing top dressing and rocks-resonated with everyone. One more priceless





piece of advice was holding your plant next to the pot you want to put it in; to get a feeling for features that are accentuated by the color of the pot.

Reminder, Emily and I recommend RSVPs for planning purposes. We often have door prizes, plant giveaways and snacks at workshops. However, even without prior notification, we can typically accommodate a last minute addition. Workshops serve not only as learning opportunities but also for building connections within the cactienthusiast community. This is a great opportunity for our new members to learn more about the cacti and succulent we all love.
